

Middle and high school poets can study figurative language, imagery, and symbolism using an interactive lesson on "Caged Bird" by Maya Angelou. Teachers can integrate literature and social studies with the "The Amazing Adventures of Equiano" interactive. Text structure, making inferences, and levels of text complexity are among the additional topics that are examined in Literature.
